APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF MAY 17, 1967

Mrs. Hall moved approval of the minutes of the meeting of May 17, 1967; Mr. Forrest seconded the motion; the motion passed.

ELECTION OF PERSONNEL COMMITTEE MEMBER

With the expiration of Mr. Marshall Forrest's term as a Trustee, a new member to the Civil Service Personnel Committee is needed; Mr. Forrest nominated Mr. Kingsbury; Mrs. Hall seconded the nomination; the nomination passed.

REPORT ON FAIRHAVEN COLLEGE

Dean Harwood gave a general report on the progress of planning for Fairhaven College, including students, the campus, curriculum, and faculty.

MARRIED STUDENT APARTMENTS

Mr. Nusbaum reported to the Board on the status of the leasing of Sehome Manor (formerly St. Joseph's Hospital). During this discussion, Mr. Kingsbury absented himself from the room (one of his law partners is the attorney for James Bolster, the owner of Sehome Manor). Mr. Nusbaum recommended the adoption of a resolution in which the Board would determine that married student housing is necessary on campus, set the conditions and general terms of the lease, and authorize the Business Manager to enter into the lease agreement subject to the review of the Attorney General's office. Mr. Forrest moved approval of Resolution #67-4 and the designation of married student housing as a part of the Western Washington State College Housing and Dining System; Mrs. Hall seconded the motion; the motion passed.

RESOLUTION No. 67-4

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Trustees of Western Washington State College establishing married student housing as a function of the Housing Officer, authorizing the lease of Sehome Manor, providing for the date, covenants, and terms of such lease and designating the Business Manager of Western Washington State College as the party to execute such lease in behalf of the Board of Trustees.

SALARIES

The proposed faculty salary schedule 1967-69 and proposed administrative salaries for 1967-68 were discussed; Mrs. Hall moved approval of faculty salary schedule (attached) and administrative salaries; Mr. Forrest seconded the motion; the motion passed.

RESOLUTION REGARDING PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON TUITION BONDS

Mr. Forrest moved adoption of the following Resolution #67-3; Mr. Kingsbury seconded the motion; the motion passed:

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Trustees of Western Washington State College regarding the amount of principal and interest payments in the 1967-68 fiscal year on the Series A, General Tuition Fee and Normal School Fund Revenue Bonds.

Mr. Forrest moved the adoption of the recommended Capital Budget for 1967-69. Mrs. Hall seconded the motion; the motion passed.

Mr. Goltz reviewed the following:

(a) AUTHORIZATION TO PROCEED WITH 67-2(A) MECHANICAL, ELECTRICAL UTILITIES EXPANSION - OLD CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS (\$185,000)

This is the portion of the original project designed by Valentine, Fisher & Tomlinson and delayed for funding. Mr. Forrest moved that Project #67-2(A) be authorized for immediate implementation and that the Division of Engineering and Architecture be authorized to negotiate a contract with Valentine, Fisher & Tomlinson to perform the design and supervision work necessary and that bids be called; Mrs. Hall seconded the motion; the motion passed.

(b) AUTHORIZATION TO PROCEED WITH 67-4(B) CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS, BUILDINGS, HAGGARD HALL

Mr. Forrest moved that authorization be given to the Division of Engineering and Architecture to negotiate an agreement with Mr. James Zervas to draw schematic plans for the remodeling of Haggard Hall in anticipation of the move by the Physics Department to the Science-Math-Computer Building; Mrs. Hall seconded the motion; the motion passed.

EDUCATION-PSYCHOLOGY BUILDING 65-4, REVISION OF PLANS TO RESPOND TO REVISION IN FUNDING - Mr. Ibsen Nelsen

In the light of recent action by the Higher Education Facilities Commission, it has been necessary to divide the Education-Psychology Building project into two phases. To effect this change and to bring past Board of Trustees actions upto-date, Mrs. Hall moved the following motion:

Phase I - total budget of \$1,855,471 (HUD #WASH-4-3030)
To be funded from \$1,704,000 of Referendum 15 funds and HEFC grants or other sources, with a Maximum Allowable Construction Cost of \$1,494,600

Phase II - total budget of \$850,000 To be funded from the 1968 bond referendum, with a Maximum Allowable Construction Cost of \$456,500

The Board of Trustees authorizes the calling for bids on Phase I and the administration and the Division of Engineering and Architecture to award the construction contract if the low bid is within available funds (bids to be opened June 29).

The Board of Trustees further authorizes the Division of Engineering and Architecture to adjust architectural agreements accordingly, and Architect Ibsen Nelsen to proceed with working drawings and specifications on Phase II in anticipation of funding approval in November 1968.

Mr. Forrest seconded the motion; the motion passed, with the Board indicating that if a problem developed in Phase I, a special meeting of the Board could be called the early part of July.

LOAN AGREEMENT - VIKING UNION ADDITION

Mr. Forrest moved approval of a resolution approving the loan agreement with the Department of Housing and Urban Development on the Student Union Building (Project No. CH-Wash-89-S) and authorizing the chairman to execute the agreement (a copy of the loan agreement is on file in the Business Manager!s office). Mr. Kingsbury seconded the motion; the motion passed.

SOUTH CAMPUS UTILITY STUDY

Mr. James Zervas reported to the Board that an agreement has been reached with R. W. Beck and Associates of Seattle, to proceed with the engineering studies necessary to complete portions of the comprehensive utility study. Mr. Goltz reported that there will be a preliminary report of findings and recommendations in the August Board meeting.

NEW FACULTY COUNCIL CHAIRMAN

The Board was introduced to Professor Walter Robinson, the new Faculty Council Chairman. As such, he will be a member of the Faculty Presidential Selection Committee.
