STUDENT ACTIVITY AND KLIPSUN FEES INCREASED

A recommendation from the Board of Control of the Associated Students was approved as follows: that the activity fee be increased \$2.50 per quarter, and the Klipsun fee be increased 50¢ per quarter for the coming year, 1952-53.

DISTRIBUTION CENTERS OF LIGHTING SYSTEM IN MAIN BUILDING

A letter under date of April 15, 1952, was read from DeWitt Dunhaver, City Electrician, and Deputy State Electrical Inspecter, demanding that the situation created by the present location of two distribution centers of the lighting system in the Main Building in the attic be corrected at once. It was agreed that the proper steps to remove these fire hazards should be taken.

REMOVAL OF LIGHT AND POWER POLES

The light and power poles extending from Garden Terrace to Twenty-First Street, it was reported, would be removed by April 24.

REQUESTS FOR CHAIRS

President Haggard reported the request of the Science Department for new tablet arm chairs for a lecture room; and a request of the Industrial Arts Department for a folding tablet arm chair to replace present tablet arm chairs. It was suggested that some surplus chairs in the choral room of the Auditorium-Music Building be traded in for chairs for the Science Department. It was decided that a recommendation should be made.

APPOINTMENTS TO THE FACULTY APPROVED

The following appointments to the faculty were approved for 1952-53:

Mark W. Flanders, State University of Iowa (M. A. degree to be conferred in August, 1952); Instructor in Speech; annual salary, \$3600.00.

Manzer J. Griswold, M. A., University of Washington. (Ph. D. degree to be conferred in June, 1952)
Assistant Professor of Sociology; annual salary, \$4200.00.

DEDICATION OF THE ARTS AND THE AUDITORIUM-MUSIC BUILDINGS

Plans were reviewed for the dedication of the Arts and the Auditorium-Music buildings, and for the Festival of Arts, scheduled for April 30, May 1 and 2.

AMLRICAN ASSOCIATION OF UNIVERSITY WOMEN

The preliminary application of the Eastern Washington College of Education at Cheney for membership in the American Association of University Women, it was reported, was not approved recently. The chief reason given for rejection at present was too few women in the institution with the Ph. D. degree and the professorial rank.

MEETING OF JOINT BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND PRESIDENTS

The evening of May 22 was announced as the tentative date for the next meeting of the Joint Board of Trustees and Presidents of the three Colleges of Education. The place of the meeting will be the Central Washington College of Education at Ellensburg.

RECRUITMENT OF STUDENTS

Recruitment of students this year was reported as the most intensive and systematic to date.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY ON THE CAMPUS

President Haggard presented the problem of political activity on the campus, including the possibility of Governor Earl Warren coming to Bellingham. Mr. Binzer stated that Governor Warren would not come to Bellingham.

PAUL W. ELLIS, ASSISTANT LEGISLATIVE AUDITOR

Dr. Paul W. Ellis, Assistant Auditor, State Legislative Budget Committee, President Haggard reported, spent a day on the campus, part of April 2 and part of April 3, checking on financial methods and reporting to Olympia. Dr. Ellis was also much interested in the preparation of the budget for the coming biennium, 1953-55.
