# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES WESTERN WASHINGTON STATE COLLEGE January 9, 1969

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS OF NOVEMBER 13 AND NOVEMBER 21, 1968

The minutes of the meetings of November 13 and November 21, 1968, were approved as prepared.

#### CAPITAL PROJECT ITEMS

# A) #69-12 Lakewood

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The Board reviewed the plans for Lakewood and also discussed the clearance of the title for the property there. Mr. Pemberton moved that the Board of Trustees accepts the Organization Plan for Lakewood (attached to the official minutes) recommended by the Auxiliary Enterprises Committee, with the exception of paragraph 2 (a), as the basis on which to proceed with the project within the Housing and Dining System; the Board of Trustees further reaffirms its obligations under the Housing and Dining Bond Resolutions and state law, and wherever there may be discrepancies the Bond Resolutions and state law shall have priority over the Organization plan. Mr. Philbrick seconded the motion; the motion passed.

B) Selection of Architects/Engineers #69-2A Heating Plant Addition

Mrs. Hall moved that the Board of Trustees appoint R. W. Beck & Associates as engineers for Project #69-2(A), Heating Plant Addition, and authorize the Division of Engineering and Architecture to negotiate an engineering contract to have the boiler design and equipment specifications drawn as a preplanning project; Mr. Pemberton seconded the motion; the motion passed.

C) Project Acceptances #67-20(A) Highland Hall Bathroom Remodeling

Mrs. Hall moved that, upon the recommendation of Project Architect Jerry Livermore, the Division of Engineering and Architecture, and the Administration, the Board of Trustees accepts the Project #67-20(A) Highland Hall Bathroom Remodeling work performed by Wick Construction Company under Contract #67-405(G), as complete as of November 26, 1968 except for minor corrective items and subject to the procedures of the Division of Engineering and Architecture and the provisions of the contract; Mr. Kingsbury seconded the motion; the motion passed.

# D) #65-4 Miller Hall (Education-Psychology Building)

Mrs. Hall moved that upon the recommendation of Project Architect Ibsen Nelson and the Administration, the Board of Trustees accepts Project #65-4, Miller Hall (Education-Psychology Building) and the work performed by Wick Construction Company under Contract #65-475-G as complete as of December 27, 1968, except for minor corrective items and subject to the procedures of the Division of Engineering and Architecture and the provisions of the contract; Mr. Philbrick seconded the motion; the motion passed.

## E) Capital Budget Revision

Mr. Goltz reported to the Board that in the process of evaluating College needs for the next biennium it became clear that following submission of the capital budget, certain modifications to the budget should be made. The total capital budget previously submitted was \$12,933,550. It is now the recommendation of the President that approval of a revised budget in the total amount of \$14,191,695 should be made, an increase of something over \$1,200,000; the major item in the increase has to do with the inflation factor.

Mr. Kingsbury moved that the Board of Trustees accepts the revisions to the 1969-71 Capital Budget Request and requests that they be directed to the appropriate state agencies for consideration; Mr. Pemberton seconded the motion; the motion passed.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF JANUARY 9, 1969

The minutes of the meeting of January 9, 1969, were approved as prepared.

#67-14 EDUCATION-PSYCHOLOGY BUILDING (MILLER HALL) PHASE !!

Mr. Goltz reported to the Board (memo to President Flora of January 31, 1969) that the bids received on Phase II of Miller Hall were very close and that the spread between them indicated that they were competitive; however, all bids received were over the allocation for this addition. He also noted that it had been decided that it would not be in the best interests of the college to rebid this project; it was recommended that the construction work to be done on the third floor be put off until such time as more funds are available and that the first two floors of the Campus School be remodeled, furnished and equipped under this bid. Mr. Pemberton moved that the Board of Trustees accept the low bid of Nelson Construction Company of Ferndale, Inc., and requests the Division of Engineering and Architecture to award an initial construction contrace on behalf of Western Washington State College; Mr. Kingsbury seconded the motion; the motion passed.

Dr. Flora joined the meeting.

### 1969-71 CAPITAL BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS BY GOVERNOR EVANS

With the information available to the Governor at the time his capital budget recommendations for Western were made known, he gave Western fair consideration. However, since that time new enrollment projections have been made public; the enrollment projections used by the Central Budget Agency were for 8,500 students in 1975 and new projections issued by the Higher Education Facilities Commission reflect 9,500 in 1971. The inflation factor used by the college to build the budget was 5% and 5% increase for each year of the biennium. This now appears to have been too low. A recommended adjustment of an additional 6% was requested in November, but has not been approved in whole or in part by the Central Budget Agency thus far.

With tentative approval by the Governor of the Library Addition, Phase II, budget request, it is recommended that Phases I and II be combined into one project-subject to acceptance by the participating federal agency.
