#### **BUSINESS MEETING**

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Chin, serving as acting chairman in the absence of Vice Chairman Paul Hanson.

Mr. Chin introduced and welcomed the two new Board members: Dr. Robert Fernald, retired marine biologist from the University of Washington, formerly Director of the University of Washington's Friday Harbor Laboratory and still associated there; and Mr. Jerrold Manley, a 1966 graduate of Western now teaching elementary school in Tacoma.

## APPROVAL OF MINUTES

At the suggestion of Mr. Chin, approval of the minutes of the January regular Board meeting was deferred until the March meeting of the Board of Trustees.

PROGRAMMING POLICY, KUGS-FM BROADCAST STATION - ACTION

Vice President McDonald requested approval of the proposed programming policy which has been approved by the ASWWSC Board of Directors and reviewed by the Assistant Attorney General. Vice President McDonald advised the Board that the station, which is an activity of the Associated Students, has been in operation for three years under authority granted by the Federal Communications Commission; and the terms of agreement require approval of an official programming policy by the Board of Trustees. Associated Students President Bruce Ayers introduced Mr. Kevin Majkut, Assistant Director of the Viking Union and advisor to the Activities Council, and Mr. Mike Smith, manager of KUGS-FM, who presented an overview of station programming and a summary of goals and directions for the station.

Motion 02-01-77 Dr. Fernald moved approval of the WWSC KUGS-FM Broadcast Station Programming Policy as proposed; seconded by Mr. Manley, the motion passed unanimously.

AMENDMENTS TO WESTERN WASHINGTON STATE COLLEGE ALL-COLLEGE SENATE CONSTITUTION - ACTION

In accordance with section 8.3 of the WWSC All-College Senate Constitution, President Olscamp recommended approval of amendments to the constitution of WWSC All-College Senate as set forth in Chairperson James Hildebrand's memorandum to President Olscamp of January 21, 1977 (attached).

Motion 02-02-77 passed un1 Mr. Manley moved approval of the amendments to the WWSC All-College Senate Constitution as presented; seconded by Dr. Fernald, the motion passed unanimously.

BUSINESS MANAGEMENT ITEM - ACTION

#### A. Capital Project

1. #75-3, Completion of Auditorium/Music Building

Vice President Cole advised the Board of Trustees that all three bids received for completion of the Auditorium/Music Building were over budget. The administration, after consultation with the project architect Henry Klein; WWSC staff Gerald Brock and Eric Nasburg; Assistant Attorney General Thomas Anderson; the Program Committee and Dean William Gregory of the College of Fine and Performing Arts, recommends that the College enter into negotiations with the low bidder, W. G. Clark, Construction Company, to modify specifications. Mr. Brock handed out copies of material pertaining to completion of the project and discussed in detail the ramifications of the administration's recommendations.

It was Mr. Anderson's opinion that modifications to be negotiated form a small percentage of the total project and that the procedure is legally defensible. He stated that the other bidders will have an opportunity to register any objections they might have prior to the awarding of the contract in late February.

Motion 02-03-77 Dr. Fernald moved, that upon the recommendation of Henry Klein, Project Architect, and the college administration, the Board of Trustees of Western Washington State College authorizes the President or his designee to negotiate modifications which do not substantially alter the original bids specifications which could result in a contract with W. G. Clark, Construction Company, and if successful in negotiations, to request the Division of Engineering and Architecture to issue a contract to W. G. Clark, Construction Company, for the completion of the Auditorium/Music Building, Project #75-3, in an amount not to exceed \$1,589,000. The President or his designee is also authorized to reinstate other alternates or changes during the contract if funds are available; seconded by Mr. Manley, the motion passed unanimously.

ITEMS FROM THE BOARD

Mr. Chin suggested that a listing of the status of all pending capital projects to be included with each agenda mailing would be informative for Board members.

ITEMS FROM THE PRESIDENT

President Olscamp reported that Bruce Ayers, Associated Students President, had joined with him in testifying before the Senate Higher Education Committee concerning the name-change bill for the three regional state universities. He thanked Mr. Ayers for his very effective testimony. The bill, Senate Bill 2085, is expected to go to the floor of the Senate in March. Hearings on the name-change bill, HB 472, are scheduled before the House Higher Education Committee on February 7.

Dr. Olscamp stated that he had also testified at a budget hearing before the House Appropriations Committee on February 2. At the hearing he emphasized Western's concerns for higher faculty salaries and fringe benefits, the academic equipment budget, and separately funded research. Dr. Olscamp expressed optimism that for the first time support for salary increases may be forthcoming from the Legislature, based on a report from the House Appropriations Committee staff that there has been a 10 percent real dollar loss in purchasing power from 1970 untilthe present time in four-year college faculties. The report used by the House Appropriations Committee staff is generated by the LEAP system, which consists of a data base that has been created over the years by the Office of Program Planning and Fiscal Management and the House Appropriations Committee and is just now reaching fruition. It is expected that LEAP system terminals will be located on Western's campus by July 1, 1977. Dr. Olscamp thanked Vice President Cole and Dr. Albers for their assistance at the February 2 budget hearing. The Senate Ways and Means Committee will consider Western's budget on March 3 (later changed to March 11 and 15).

The President reported that he has initiated a practice of visiting newspaper editorial boards throughout the state, noting that an editorial in the February 2 SEATTLE TIMES supportive of Western's case for a name change is first evidence of the success of this policy.

The presidents of Washington's four-year state colleges and universities have been invited to meet with Governor Ray in Olympia on February 17.

Copies of Governor Ray's Executive Order 77-2 were handed out to Trustees. The President commented that provisions of the order have been discussed with the Office of Program Planning and Fiscal Management, and it is the belief of administrative officials that the interpretation of the order will allow for planned operations at least through June 30.

Dr. Olscamp announced that, in conformance with past practices, the two new members of the Board will come to the campus for a day-long orientation session on Saturday, March 19.

At the request of Dr. Olscamp, Vice Provost Albers presented a report on Western's enrollment history and the faculty staffing formula for 1977-78. Copies of the report were distributed to the Board.
