May 6, 1936

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees was held at the Normal School on May 6, 1936. Those present were Dr. W. D. Kirkpatrick, Chairman; Mr. Verne Branigin, Secretary; Mr. Steve Saunders, and President C. H. Fisher.

The minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

BALANCE FOR CONTINGENCIES FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION BUILDING

Three thousand (\$3000.00) dollars was allowed in the general contract for the finish hardware. Up to date the following amount has been contracted for: \$210,891.78; which includes the \$3000.00 for the finish hardware. If the lowest bid for the finish hardware is accepted, the amount contracted for will be \$210,271.44. The total amount available is \$211,692.13. This leaves a palance to date for contingencies of \$1,420.69.

REPORT FROM THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF TEACHERS COLLEGES

According to a report received from Charles W. Hunt, Secretary of the American Association of Teachers Colleges, the State formal School at pellingham is on the accredited list with one deficiency in Standard IV, Preparation of Faculty. Our standing among accredited Teacher Training institutions with respect to student-teacher ratio is in the middle 50%. Our standing with respect to expenditures for library books is in the upper 25%.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR NEW ROOF ON MAIN BUILDING

The President was sked to prepare specifications for a new shingle roof on the main building, the same to be submitted at the next meeting. It was reported that \$12,500 was appropriated for this purpose.
