The Board of Trustees met at their offices in the Normal School at 4 p. m. Present: Trustees Barlow and Olson, the President and the Secretary.

Minutes of the meeting of September 20th were read and ^{corrected} as to the matter of salaries of Miss Thomas, Mrs. Snyder and Mrs. Brown, and then approved.

BIDS ON MEAT AND GROCERIES:

A number of bids from the leading markets of the city on meats of numerous kinds, as required by Edens Hall, were submitted and compared.
