Minutes of the egular monthly meeting of the Fourd of Trustees of the Bellingham State Normal School held in their room this afternoon at 3 0'clock.

Present: Chairman J. J. Edens, Trustee J. J. Bonovan, Principal Mathes and the Registrar.

Minutes of the meetings of Jan. 14 and Feb. 15 read and approved.

W. H. Boyd, student fireman, on recommendation of Frincipal Mathes, was authorized to present a bill for extra labor of \$4.00 per month for the months of January, February and March. It was further ordered that his wages be increased to \$15.00 per month for the months of April and May.

It was ordered that a man be employed on the campus from the 1st of April to the 1st of October at a salary of \$60.00 per month. The name of Thamas Hendershott was offered by the principal. On motion of Trustec Donovan, the principal was authorized to purchase not to exceed \$100.00 worth of commercial fertilizer for the campus.

On motion of Trustee Donovan, a direct appropriation of \$500.00 was made for two concrete tennis courts and Prof. Philippi, as chairman, Prof. Eond and Student Frank H. Whipple were empowered to expend that a ount to the best advantage.

Prof. Decreester, on recommendation of the principal was named Dean of the summer school this year.

The Registrar and Brincipal were directed to work out a detailed statement of legislative appropriations for departmental supplies and subdivide them on the percentage basis.

On motion of Trustee Donovan, it was ordered that each member of the faculty be authorized to submit a list of books annually not to exceed \$50.00 in value, for additions to the library for use in their departments.

The principal announced that Prof. Romine and Miss Jensen had been added to the committee of the faculty, appointed previously, to wait on the board and discuss the matter of summer school and salaries.

The Registrar was instructed to prepare for the convenience of the board any data he may have bearing on the matter of summer school and salaries and present a statement to the members of the board tefore the next meeting; also to notify the faculty committee to prepare in typewritten form any data they desire to present for the board's consideration.

On motion of Trustee Donovan the \_following bills were approved for payment:
