Campus Mobilizes To Protest Kent State Killings, Cambodia

Flora issues view

President Charles Flora issued the following statement yesterday concerning the class strike which is in effect today through Friday:

The recent extension of the Vietnam war and the related deaths of four students at Kent State University make it painfully clear that as never before, this college, like our nation, is wracked by great pain. It is time that we at Western Washington State College find some way to express our concern without abrogating our responsibilities as a public institution.

And this is not an easy course to chart.

As President of Western Washington State College, I believe strongly that we must not ignore this great problem, and I feel it necessary that some appropriate course be found.

The following are the views of our student government and of the administration and we agreed to the following:

1. That Western Washington State College is to remain open.
2. That we must maintain the educational atmosphere of the college.
3. That in their role as private citizens, all members of this community are encouraged to focus upon the Vietnam war, especially the Cambodian extension and the related tragic Kent State incident.
4. No one in this institution should fear retribution for taking part or not taking part in the educational activities which are being developed, and will be announced.
5. Because many students will probably be away from regularly scheduled classes on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of this week, faculty members are encouraged to make their curricular plans accordingly.
6. At the option of the individual faculty members, teach-ins having to do with this vital problem may be held.
7. A committee consisting of administrators, faculty members and students has been established to coordinate and plan activities to be held on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of this week. These activities will be announced as scheduled.

Rally slated today

In the midst of Western's boycott of classes a committee has been formed to "coordinate and plan activities to be held Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of this week," President Charles J. Flora said yesterday.

Merrill E. Lewis, faculty committee member, said that plans are being made to establish an "International Union, now the AS office in the Viking Union.

A rally will be held this morning in Red Square at 11 to help establish some ideas for teach-ins, lectures and a planned television program with several state representatives, Greg Baker, AS president, said last night.

To take any other ideas for activities during the strike period, committee meetings will be held every morning at 10 a.m. and at 2 p.m. in a location to be announced.

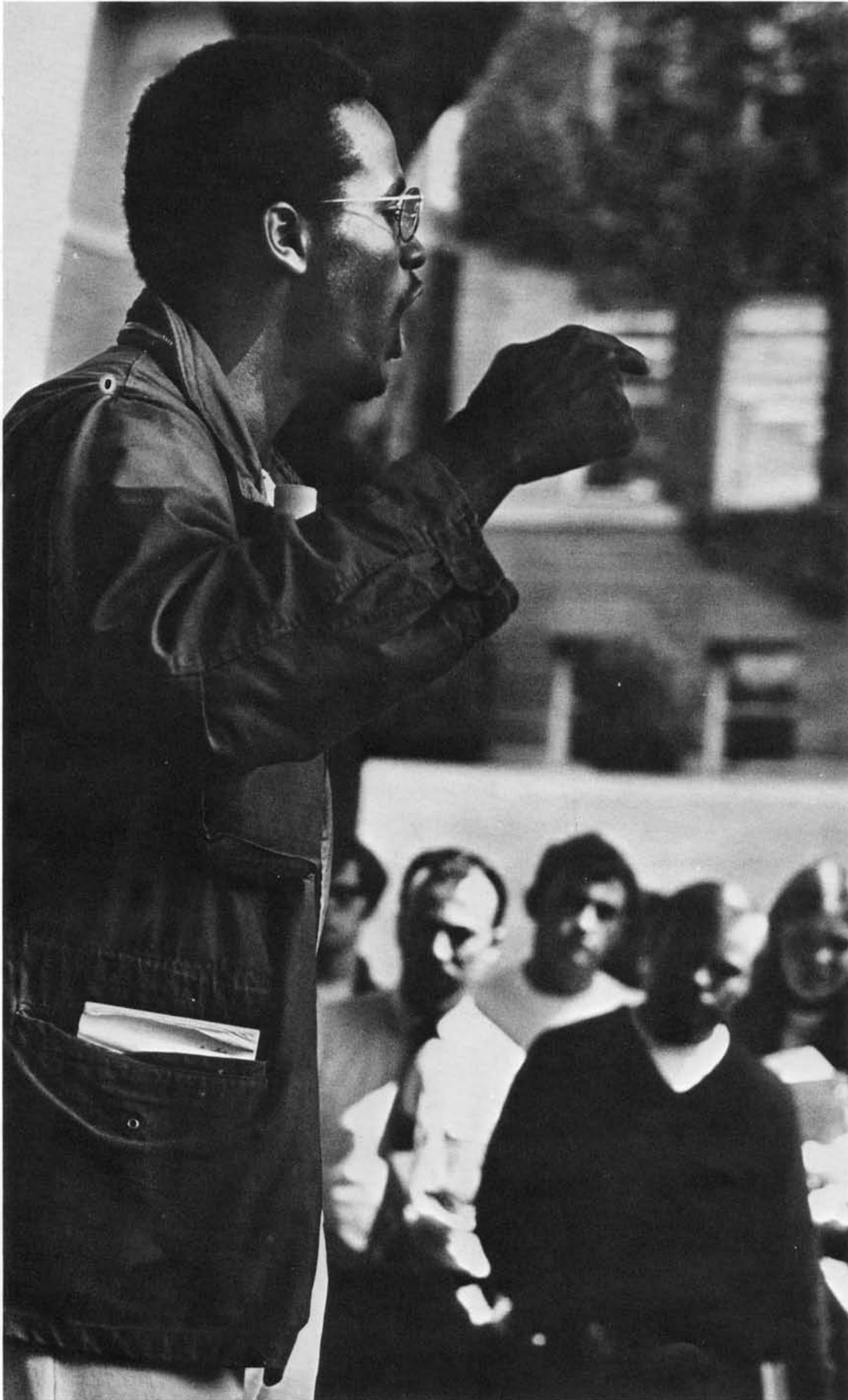

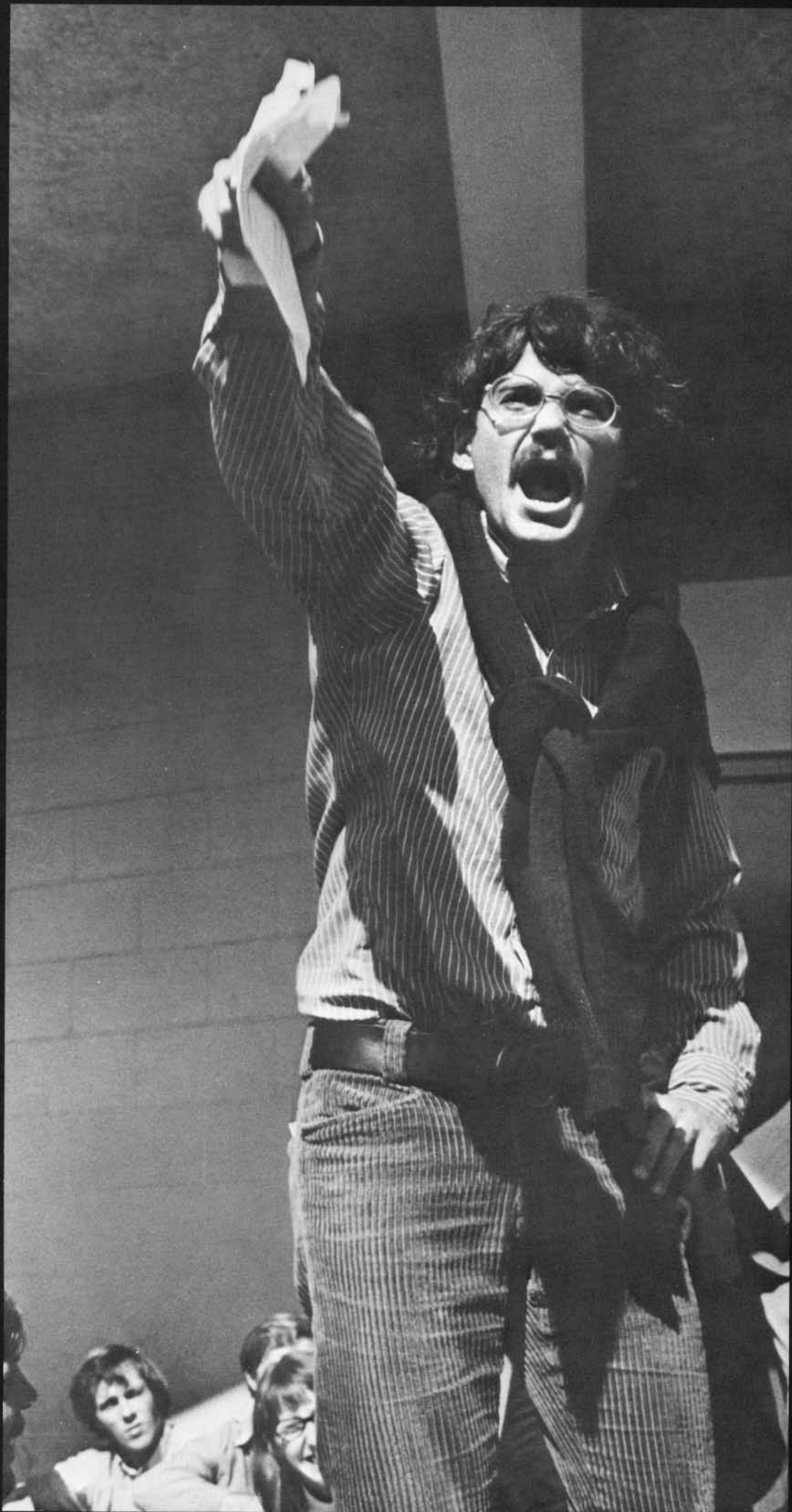

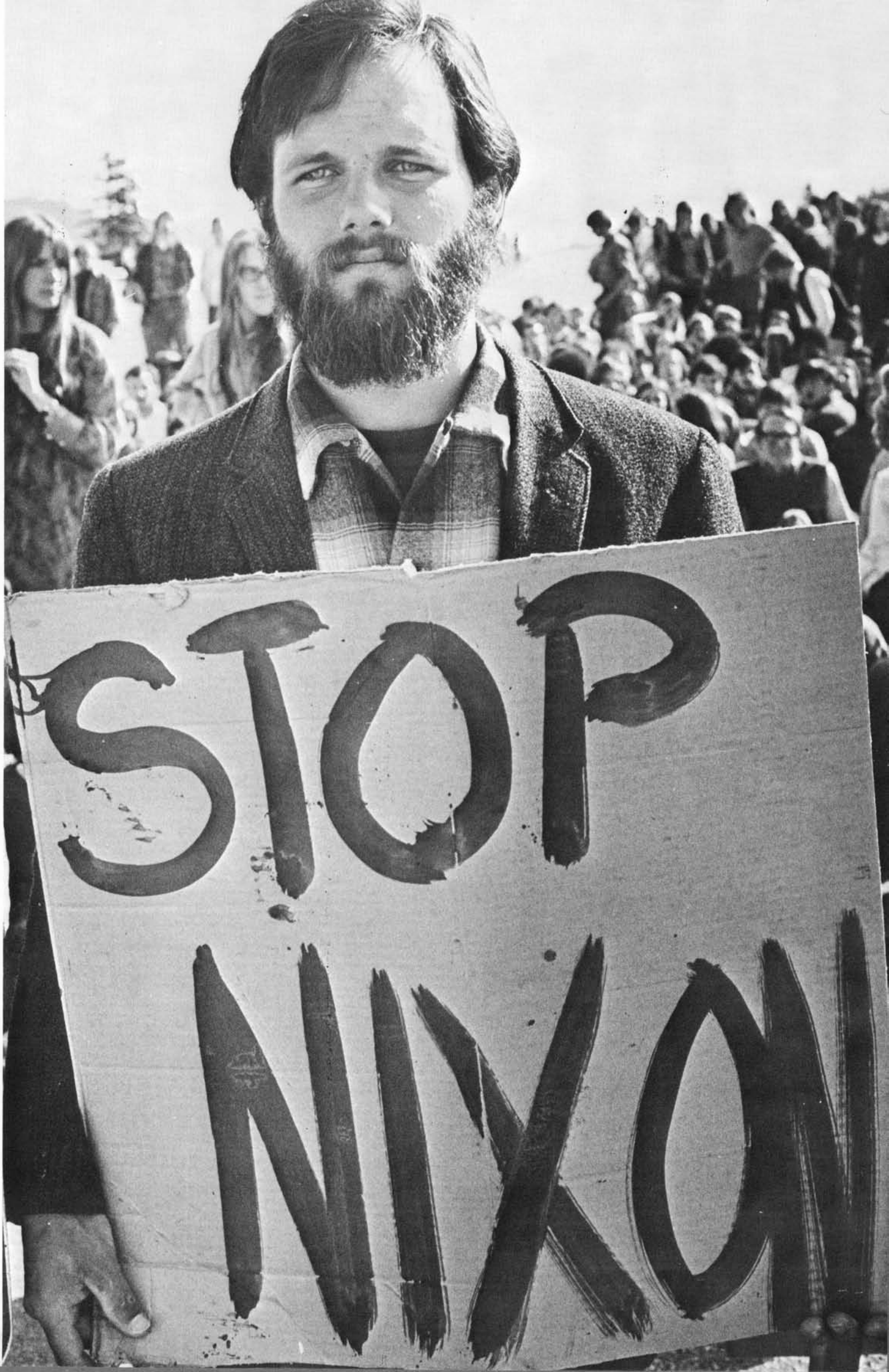
